OFFICE OF ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT REPORT

March 2017

REPORT

The third quarter of Fiscal Year 2017 began with a flurry of activities related to Championship Game Week that included “Wear Red Week,” outreach to area businesses to support Penguin Pride with electronic or poster signage, media interviews, a Penguin Championship Send-Off, and the coordination of 11 Watch Parties across the country. The collaborative efforts involved the office of Alumni Engagement and all departments within University Relations, the Alumni Society Advisory Board, Athletics and Student Activities.

Pete’s Pride volunteers reached 4,000-plus hours of collective service since the program’s inception and are scheduled for a variety of service activities through the spring. On January 14, more than 80 Alumni Society and Pete’s Pride members attended a Basketball Doubleheader “Picnic” between the Women’s and Men’s Games. Analysis of calendar year-end Showcase Tailgate Tent attendance numbers showed a 209% increase in average attendance per tailgate, from 63 to 195. The Office of Alumni Engagement plans to take advantage of increased Penguin spirit by scheduling alumni social gatherings in seven of the 11 Watch Party cities plus Phoenix, Atlanta, Los Angeles and Chicago between February and October 2017.

Under the leadership of David Moore, the Alumni Society Board members have stepped up efforts to enhance the profile of the Alumni Society through an increased public presence at alumni events, active community outreach, influencing strategic media coverage and assisting with regional Watch Parties in New York and Cincinnati.

New and renewing memberships were down significantly through December 31, 2016, from 1,010 and \$63,980 in Q2-2016 to 711 and \$31,610 in Q2-2017. The decrease is not unexpected as the FY16 appeal was an acquisition mailing of 50,000, while the FY17 appeal was sent to a smaller target audience of 11,000 based on geographic area and event attendance. Renewal efforts will continue through the fiscal year. All activities fall in line with one or more of the Alumni Engagement Strategic Plan Cornerstones.

Following are examples of Alumni Engagement activities that support Cornerstones 2 and 3.

Championship Week Activities:

Business Outreach - Electronic Signs and Posters, Board members went door to door to encourage area businesses and organizations to show their support for YSU and the football team by including messages of good will on their electronic signs or by hanging free, printable posters in their windows. Hundreds participated – from restaurants to dry cleaners, from the Mahoning County Public Library to grocery stores.

“Wear Red Week” was declared for January 2-7 in the Mahoning Valley.

Extensive Local Media Presence, including front-page coverage in *The Vindicator* and *Tribune Chronicle* (see attachments); television morning shows; radio; *Daily Buzz*; online and social media.

Frisco on Top of the World Live Radio Show, January 4, 2017. Alumnus John Hart, '76, who lives in Frisco, represented YSU on a live radio broadcast from Frisco, to talk about YSU, its history and traditions, and the upcoming game.

A total of 40 alumni reports were prepared per campus-wide requests for use by Alumni Engagement, academic departments, and athletic events, representing a total of 271,944 records. 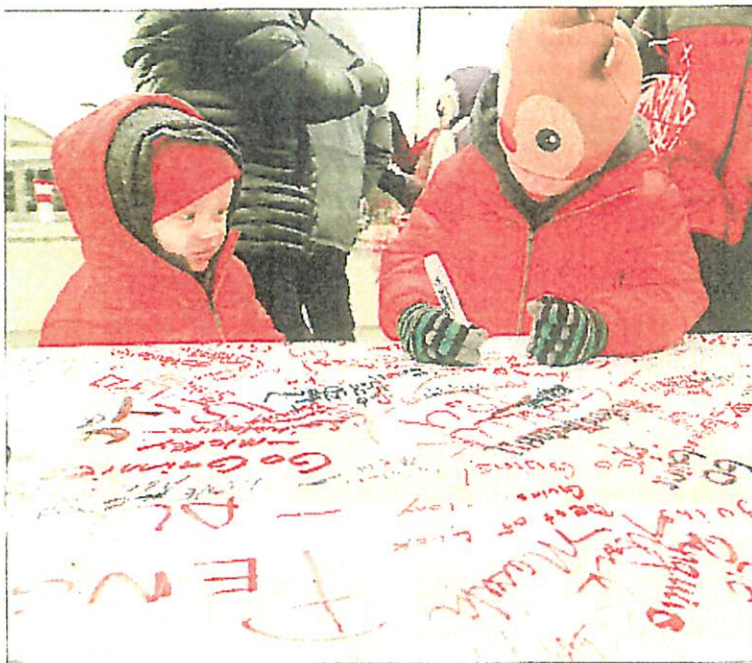

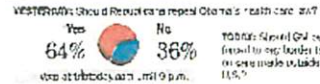

Strong financial profile

Standard & Poor's, one of the nation's top credit-rating agencies, upgraded YSU's bond rating to A+, citing increased enrollment demand, a strong financial profile and solid management policies. In addition, Moody's Investors Services reaffirmed YSU's A2 rating, and both agencies assigned the university a "stable outlook." "These ratings signify to investors that YSU represents a high quality investment with only moderate risk," said Neal McNally, vice president for Finance and Business Operations. "But, just as important, the ratings reflect the hard work of many people on campus to begin to eliminate the university's structural budgetary challenges and to establish long-term enrollment strategies."



Spanning the Globe

YSU signed partnership agreements with nearly a dozen Asian universities as part of an ongoing effort to expand international education initiatives. Representatives from YSU visited China, South Korea, Japan and Taiwan over the course four weeks, meeting with officials from 23 universities to discuss future academic collaborations, including student study abroad and faculty exchange agreements.

group explored during the trip. "Israel and the entire Middle East offer tremendous opportunities to build relationships and establish partnerships to benefit our students and faculty as well as the Mahoning Valley community," YSU President Jim Tressel said.

Meanwhile, a delegation from YSU and the Youngstown Business Incubator visited Israel for a week in January. Student internships, faculty exchanges, joint research, industry partnerships and business connections were among the opportunities that the

\$7.5M and counting

YSU faculty and staff earned \$7.5 million in grants this past fiscal year, the largest amount in five years. "We certainly had a banner year thanks to the hard work and dedication of so many talented faculty and staff on campus," said Mike Hripko, associate vice president for Research. "We hope to build on this momentum as we continue to raise the research profile of the university."

First in Ohio

YSU and Humtown Products cut the ribbon on a state-of-the-art 3D sand printer valued at nearly \$1 million that will further advance additive manufacturing in the Mahoning Valley. The printer, the only one of its kind in the state of Ohio, is housed at Humtown's new 3D mold manufacturing facility in Leetonia. The printer, secured via an Ohio Third Frontier grant to YSU and America Makes, will support the metal casting industry throughout Ohio. The facility will also serve as a classroom and laboratory for engineering students from YSU and other universities and community colleges in Northeast Ohio.



Perfection...again

For the second consecutive year, YSU physical therapists were perfect. All 27 students who received the Doctor of Physical Therapy degree from YSU in May 2016 passed the National Physical Therapy Examination on the first attempt. Last year, all 23 students passed.



Phase II

YSU officials joined representatives from Hallmark Campus Communities, Fortress Real Estate Companies and Barnes & Noble College to break ground on the second phase of the University Edge student apartments and a new Barnes & Noble campus bookstore on the West Side of campus. "This development along Fifth Avenue meets many of the priorities that we have set out for YSU to build and sustain growth for the years ahead," YSU President Jim Tressel said. "It allows us to continue to expand recruitment efforts

outside the immediate region, to offer high-quality alternative housing on campus and to continue to build a full and thriving college environment and experience for our students."

"The Catch"

The Penguins scored a touchdown with 1 tick on the clock to beat Eastern Washington 40-38 and advance to the FCS national championship game in Frisco, Texas. While YSU fell to James Madison in the championship game, Bo Pelini's team, unranked as the year began, came out of nowhere to go 12-4 and win four playoff games on its way to the university's best football season in years.

Student thumb-ups

The vast majority of YSU freshmen and seniors who responded to a recent survey give high marks to their overall experience at YSU and say they would attend the university again. Those are among the results of the latest National Survey of Student Engagement. "This survey is further evidence that YSU provides a quality education and campus experience that students find to be valuable," President Jim Tressel said.



Check out the web

YSU has launched a redesigned website aimed at enhancing the university's branding and recruitment efforts. The new website at www.ysu.edu, which serves as the university's front door to hundreds of thousands of visitors every year, is the result of more than a year of planning, design, collaboration and feedback involving dozens of faculty, staff, students, high school students and parents across every college of YSU and the community.

It's a bird. It's a plane. It's....well, it's another wind turbine.

A third wind turbine - this one more than 100-feet high in the sky with a large, hooded blade windmill - was installed this past fall next to Melnick Hall at the corner of Wick Avenue and the Madison Avenue Expressway service road. Two smaller turbines were installed in fall 2015 at the same location as part of a federal research grant aimed at developing alternative energy resources. The research, funded with grants totaling more than \$2 million from the U.S. Department of Energy, focuses on the extraction of wind power in areas of low wind speed.
