
Fall-to-Fall Retention Reports

Please find enclosed the 2013-2014 fall-to-fall retention figures for students using the Center for Student Progress. The following results are of note:


- During the 2013-14 academic year, the Center had over 43,200 sessions with 5,880 students of all ranks.
- The retention rate of **all first-time**, **full-time** YSU undergraduates was 69% as compared to 70% for the 1,471 first-time, full-time students who used the Center.
- The retention rate for all first-time, full-time YSU undergraduates who did not use the Center was 60%.
- The retention rate of first-time students who used the Center 10 or more times was 80%.
- The retention rate of **all first-time YSU minority** undergraduates was 50% as compared to 54% for those using the Center.
- The retention rate of YSU **first-time minority** students who did **not** use the Center was 35%.
- The retention rate for all YSU minority students who used the Center was 63%.
- Each of YSU's six colleges posted higher fall-to-fall retention rates for their first-time students who used the Center for Student Progress.
