- Campus and Facilities
- Student Population
- Student Life
- Academic Programs
- Faculty
- Governance
- Strategic Plan
- Finances
- Institutional Advancement
- Challenges and Opportunities Ahead
- SWOT analysis
- Local and Regional Impact Assessment

Data accompanying a *Case Study* might include:
