Academic Program Enhancement and Effectiveness Initiative

Through a Request for Proposals process, APEEI is supported by Gray Associates having developed an information interface with data on nearly all fields of study catalogued in the U.S. Department of Education's Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP). With the Gray Associates platform, it is possible to assess competitors' program offerings, local and national student demand, and employment opportunities for over 1,000 fields of study. These data are useful in identifying new programs to be considered, and opportunities for enhancing the viability of the current academic programs. Also available via the Gray platform are program economics that supports assessment of the effectiveness and efficiency of academic program offerings.
