- \$1.5M state operating request to fund last mile operating and technology needs for the IT Workforce Accelerator and expansion of the Tressel Institute for Leadership and Teamwork into Mahoning and Trumbull county high school programs.
- \$500K state operating request for continuation of funding for ETC operating needs.

### **Center Overview**

The EV Academy will serve as a National Hub to help the emerging electric vehicle industry build and scale a sustainable workforce around advanced manufacturing, energy storage and other integrated technology solutions, such as artificial intelligence, 5G and cybersecurity. The goal is to bring together industry, academia and government under a connected open source approach to share resources, best practices and programs to serve the workforce needs with greater agility.

- Finalizing MOU, including priority training labs, equipment
- Battery credentials under development
- EV 101 credential curriculum design under development
- Participated on the State's leadership team in developing EV Workforce Strategy



IT Workforce Accelerator at Silvestri Hall Lindsey Ekstrand, Director

### **Center Overview**

Established through industry partnerships with IBM, WIA, Cisco and others, the IT Workforce Accelerator delivers in-demand IT skills training around software development, cybersecurity, cloud, artificial intelligence, networking and telecommunications.

## Updates

- Open positions include networking and telecommunications and general IT program managers and instructors. GA students in process to supplement teaching and mentorship needs.
- Subsequent to current reporting period, YSU was selected by the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation to lead the 5G and Broadband Industry Sector Node across all of Team Neo's 18 county footprint. YSU, in collaboration with Lorain County Community College, Tri-C, CSU, Ashland University, North Central State, and Cuyahoga Valley Career Center will launch multi-county training programs focused on 5G, Broadband and Cell Tower Technicians. Initial grant, split between partners, of \$1.2M with anticipated funding through 2025 to expand across all academic institutions.
- The Data Mine will now be run under the IT Workforce Accelerator. Anticipated new clients include YSU Student Success, Team Neo, DriveOhio, Nuvve.



Excellence Training Center (ETC) at Kohli Hall Jackie Ruller, Director



### **Center Overview**

This 54,000 state-of-the-art advanced manufacturing technology center is located on Main Campus and is equipped with over \$15M of advanced manufacturing and research equipment. From additive manufacturing to industrial electronics and leading the way in advanced robotics, the ETC serves students and industry in developing in-demand capabilities.

## Updates

- The ETC Industrial Advisory Board has been formally established.
- DLA/UNI Option B submitted for new round of funding.
- Summer camps scheduled Jun Aug.
- Industrial maintenance classes have been modularized to meeting growing demand. Classes filled through Oct 2023.
- Open positions include Robotics Program Manager, Advanced Mfg Research.

### **Center Overview**

Located just south of campus, this 220-acre open air research park will be used by YSU students and area K-12 students to launch their STEM projects for engineering, biosciences, aviation and more! (opening July 2023)

#### Updates

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Hazel Marie to the post of Program Director for Williamson Innovation Park.

Dr. Marie will serve as STEM Champion and Program Director of WIP to establish experiential learning opportunities for K-12 students and adult learners while developing strategies to engage industry partnerships and external fundraising initiatives that support the WIP mission and vision. In addition, will leverage WIP resources to facilitate related YSU faculty research projects and student experiential learning opportunities, including STEM competition teams, establishment of training and certification opportunities for the community partners as well as YSU students. Lastly, will facilitate related STEM engagement activities with Watson Team Center (WTC) and Excellence Training Center (ETC) to enhance experiential learning activities.
