FIRST YEAR EXPLORATORY UNDECIDED MAJORS

Students who declare Exploratory Undecided as a major will focus on completing required General Education courses their first semester and meet an advisor to assess their interests and skills and explore majors and careers. Students should expect to register for an English composition course, a First-Year Experience course, any required developmental courses (if applicable), and 2 courses that fulfill General Education requirements.

The courses listed in each table below represent typical courses for a first year exploring student. Each student's schedule may look different based upon the answers provided on the Pre-registration Survey, math and other course placements, and course availability. Since students' required math course depends on their major, possible major selection as well as math placement will determine if an Exploratory Undecided student should take math their first semester. Students who have earned college credit for any of the courses below will work with an advisor to identify appropriate courses for the first semester.

Your academic advisor will make every effort to accommodate your schedule preferences; however, course availability will be limited in many cases, and may mean that have to take a course at a time that might not be what you would prefer. It is important to remember that your advisor has your long term goals in mind as you work toward pursuing your degree and career.
