FIRST YEAR HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT MAJORS

Students should expect to take an English Composition course, a math course, an introductory course to the hospitality industry, and a course in food science and management principles. Your advisor may recommend that you take an introductory course in psychology, a general education course, or a first-year experience course introducing you to study in the Bitonte College of Health and Human Services. All courses will help you complete the YSU degree.

The courses listed in each table below represent typical courses for a first year student in this major or majors. Each student's schedule may look different based upon the answers provided on the Preregistration Survey, math and other course placements, and course availability. Students who have earned college credit for any of the courses below will work with an advisor to identify appropriate courses for the first semester.

Your academic advisor will make every effort to accommodate your schedule preferences; however, course availability will be limited in many cases, and may mean that have to take a course at a time that might not be what you would prefer. It is important to remember that your advisor has your long term goals in mind as you work toward pursuing your degree and career.
