Students should expect to take an English Composition course, a math course, Introduction to Health and Human Services, Anatomy & Physiology, and General Psychology in their first semester.

Students who have earned college credit for any of the courses below will work with an advisor to identify appropriate courses for the first semester.

When you receive your first semester schedule, it may not match exactly with the courses listed below. There are times when courses might not be available. If you do not have the courses listed below your first semester, please be assured that the courses you will be taking are required for your degree.

Your academic advisor will make every effort to accommodate your schedule preferences; however, course availability will be limited in many cases, and may mean that have to take a course at a time that might not be what you would prefer. It is important to remember that your advisor has your long term goals in mind as you work toward pursuing your degree and career.

Students pursuing majors in the Health and Human Services fields are held to a higher ethical and moral standard in serving the public. Students will be expected to maintain a clean credit report and criminal history. If you have any concerns, you should discuss these concerns with an academic advisor or your intended department chair.

IMPORTANT NOTES

• Students must be registered for or have completed all Pre-Nursing coursework by the end of the Spring semester to be admitted to the Nursing Program for the following Fall semester. Current students must apply by 4:00 PM on the 3rd Tuesday of January each year.

- Students must have earned a grade of C or better in all Pre-Nursing courses, have a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or greater in all college coursework, and have a Pre-Nursing GPA of 3.0 or greater to be admitted to the Nursing Program and to complete the Nursing program in four years.
- Applicants may not have (within the last 5 years) more than 2 repetitions in any Pre-Nursing course.
- If student has not completed high school Biology and high school Chemistry with a grade of C or higher, this program will take a total of 5 years to complete.
