In February 2024, Academic Senate approved the use of a new tool to be used to collect end of semester student feedback from each of their courses. You may remember these being referred to as *Student Evaluation of Faculty* or *course evaluations* but going forward they will be called the "**Student Course Feedback Survey**."

Faculty, staff, and student representatives of the Senate Teaching and Learning Committee worked together to revise questions to focus on concrete behaviors and actions in the classroom that align with YSU teaching expectations – guided by the <u>Reciprocal Responsibilities for Students and Instructors</u> and <u>Principles of Good Practice in Teaching</u>. Questions were also added to ask students to reflect on their own behaviors in the classroom, to help give context to interpreting and acting on responses.


<u>Student Course Feedback Surveys</u> will continue to be delivered to students via the Watermark Course Evaluation system. You can review questions <u>here</u>. We are hopeful this new tool helps provide actionable feedback and continues to support effective teaching and student learning at YSU!
