Interested in Psychology? You can take the courses below through College Credit Plus to start your path to a degree in Psychology. To simplify things, we've laid out an example of a semester-by-semester plan for you. Please work closely with your College Credit Plus advisor and high school counselor to select the coursework that makes sense based on your goals.

After you've completed these courses, save even more time and money by finishing your associate degree through the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway in Psychology and then transferring to a public university with junior standing and half of your bachelor's degree in Psychology complete.

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State and YSU Updates - State

- **State Auditors Report issued in August 2022**
 - Recommendations focused on program participation and operations.
- *Last year we discussed items that could impact schools, including:*
 - Standardized marketing materials for schools to share with families;
 - Increase the number of high school-based classes;
 - If future funding is provided for instructor credentialing, there may be a required service period.
 - Provide access to technology to help eliminate a barrier in participating in campus/online classes, esp. for underserved students;
 - Default funding formulas could change;
 - How textbooks are paid for could change; use of more open educational resource materials;
 - State stakeholder meetings are discussing recommendations; could be within the next year (or more) before we see changes (if any);



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State and YSU Updates - State

• Recommendations - Program Participation

1. Consistent communication and marketing of the program through standardized CCP communication forms.
2. Increase number of high school-based courses offered by sharing of teachers, credentialing additional high school teachers, or leveraging the ESC to provide CCP instruction.
3. Future funding for credentialing should include attainment of CCP credential and a required service period.
4. The state should work to minimize barriers to participation such as limited access to support services and high-speed internet to help increase the number of traditionally underserved students, particularly those that are low-income or minority, participating in CCP.
5. Standardized CCP orientation.



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State and YSU Updates - State

• Recommendations - Program Operations (ODHE, ODEW)

6. Program oversight needs established, and data collection enhanced to include outcome data; formal goals and metrics developed to ensure desired programmatic outcomes are being achieved and identify areas of improvement.
7. Identify who is responsible for program oversight.
8. Identify data collection issues so that it is complete and consistent.
9. General Assembly should review the default payment rates to ensure that they appropriately reflect the current cost to IHE's to provide CCP courses.
10. Textbooks – look at funding model, use of OER's to reduce costs.



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State and YSU Updates - State

• Recommendation's Rolled-Out

• #2: Teacher Credentialing Grant

- Part of the budget bill (HB 33); \$6 million dollars allocated.
- Application will be similar to last RFP (2019).
- Preference given to consortiums that partners with "priority" schools.
 - Ex – regional application with multiple colleges, school districts that meets providing classes in a way to earn credentialing sooner rather than later.
- "Priority" schools =
 1. Low participation in CCP, AP or other college in HS opportunities.
 2. Serves high population of economically disadvantaged and or under-represented students.
- RFP was due to be released around Thanksgiving.



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State and YSU Updates - State

• Recommendation's Rolled-Out

• #2: Course Incentivization

- \$5.5 million allocated to provide \$1,000 to districts who offer a "NEW" CCP course taught at the high school with 25% begin given to the instructor.
- Reimbursement based on data submitted to the state; no application.
- Still pending:
 - Defining a "NEW" course: possibly one that has not been offered in the last three years; not sure yet.
 - How it will be distributed; Potential of being given to "priority" schools first.

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State and YSU Updates - YSU

• Academic Advising completed by CCP staff

- Began Summer 2022 with new students; now all CCP students advised by our office except students who are full-time on campus and working toward degree requirements (college advisor).
- Any student who wants to take a campus or online course must meet with a CCP advisor **BEFORE** they can register for classes.

• Barnes and Noble (BN) Bookstore

- *Reminder* - Our office sends the roster of campus/online students for each school district who opts to use BN for textbooks

College Credit Plus

What is College Credit Plus?

College Credit Plus (CCP) is a dual-enrollment program for college-ready 11th through 12th graders. You can earn both high school and college credit by taking courses at your high school (if offered), on YSU's campus, or online.

- **At Your High School:**
 - You take the course at your high school during your regular high school day.
 - High school CCP instructors have the same qualifications as YSU faculty.
- **YSU's Campus / Online:**
 - You either come to campus, or take the class online, with YSU faculty.
 - Your high school may provide you with computer access and time during the school day to complete your work.
 - You cannot register and you see your academic advisor and attend after New Student Orientation or a Continuing Student Update session. Space in the class is not guaranteed.
 - Classes follow the YSU calendar, which is different from your high school calendar (vacation dates, holidays and snow days are very rare).

College Credit Plus in Honors

If you have a 3.5 cumulative high school GPA and a 3.0 or higher ACT Composite score, you are eligible to participate in the CCP in Honors program. You will be identified for the prerogative opportunity during the CCP admission process and can earn Honors credit for classes you complete on the YSU campus.

How is it funded?

- **Option B:** Tuition to you. This option is available only to Ohio residents. Your high school pays tuition and also textbooks. YSU waives course fees. You earn both high school and college credit.
- **Option A:** You pay for tuition, books, and materials, and can choose to receive only college credit (tuition is not factored into the high school GPA) or both high school and college credit. If you want high school credits, you will need to ask to have the course added to your transcript before the 180th day of the college semester the course is taught. Only courses eligible to be taken under College Credit Plus can be taken under Option A. It is not a CCP-eligible course, you are not allowed to take it, even if it is self-pay. This is state policy.
- If you are non-public or home-schooled student and did not get enough State funding for Option B, you can self-pay under Option A.
- Out-of-state students self-pay using Option A rates.

CCP Eligibility vs. YSU Admission

- **Reminder!** CCP Eligibility **does NOT equal** YSU Admission.
- Students qualify for **CCP Eligibility AND YSU Admission** by having the required GPA requirements **AND** either a qualifying ACT/SAT **OR** Accuplacer score.
- Three options available!
 - If students meet all criteria in any one of the three options, then they meet state CCP Eligibility and YSU admission requirements.
- To make it easier for families to understand, we combine both criteria together.



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Eligibility and Admission: Option One

A student can qualify through this option if they meet all the following:

- ACT Composite Score of 17 **OR** SAT combined score of 920 **AND**
- HS cumulative, unweighted GPA of 2.0 **AND**
- HS core, unweighted GPA of 2.0 **AND**
- At least **ONE** of the following ACT/SAT scores:
 - ACT English 18, Math 22 or Reading 22
 - SAT Writing/Reading 480 or Math 530

CORE GPA = only English, Math, Social Studies, Science, and any foreign language classes.



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Eligibility and Admission: Option Two

A student can qualify through this option if they meet all the following:

- ACT Composite Score of 17 (or SAT combined score of 920) **AND**
- HS cumulative, unweighted GPA of **3.0 AND**
- HS core, unweighted GPA of 2.0



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Eligibility and Admission: Option Three

A student can qualify through this option if they meet all the following:

- HS cumulative, unweighted GPA of 2.0 **AND**
- HS core, unweighted GPA of 2.0 **AND**
- At least one of the following Accuplacer scores (aka YSU Eligibility and Admission Test):
 - Writing: 263
 - Reading: 250
 - Math: 263



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YSU Eligibility and Admission Test

- Students complete the Accuplacer Reading Test.
 - Required score needed is 250.
 - Students who do not meet the score will be given one more opportunity to test.
 - We do NOT retest on the same day. This is not a best practice.
- YSU CCP Staff will discuss with student his/her results and provide directions on how to retest.
 - We may ask the school to verify the students GPA by emailing a transcript.
 - Students who test at the school can also call our office and request retesting information.
- **Note:** Students admitted to the program through this option **WILL** need to complete course placement testing in English and Math to qualify for certain courses. We do not use Accuplacer for course placement.



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YSU Eligibility and Admission Test

- Your school can schedule time for a YSU staff member to proctor the test in your building (email ccp@ysu.edu).
 - Requires school to provide a roster of student contact information, including birthdate, no less than 5 business days ahead of the test date.
 - We are limited on how many students we can test onsite, so we encourage you to select those students who will benefit from testing in your building.
 - Students who require accommodations will not be able to test onsite. They will need to sign up with our office and meet with YSU Accessibility Services first.
 - Schedule at least two weeks before deadline to allow students time who need to retest.

OR

- Families can call the CCP office to sign up (beginning October 1) and take the test virtually or on campus.

Note: We are not allowed to share these scores with other colleges/universities. Therefore, we can only test students interested in attending YSU for CCP.



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YSU Eligibility and Admission Test Deadlines

NEW Rolling Deadlines for Sign Up & Completion

- **Summer 2024 – All Students**
 - Sign up by March 1
 - Complete test/retest by March 15.
- **Fall 2024/Spring 2025 – Non-public and Home School Students**
 - Sign up by March 15
 - Complete test/retest by March 25
- **Fall 2024/Spring 2025 – Public School Students**
 - Sign up by April 1
 - Completed test/retest by April 15
- Deadline for schools to request a testing day on site at your school for fall/spring classes is **March 1, 2024**.
 - We can't guarantee a testing date by the deadline if you wait and request a test day on March 1.



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Application Days/Deadlines

- Either in-person or virtual beginning mid-January.

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Application Materials

- Transcript with any ACT/SAT scores available, overall GPA, and SSID, for **ALL** students
 - Will continue to accept unsigned, unsealed transcripts if sent from coordinator's school email
- Non-YSU college transcripts
 - Cannot transfer in college courses from HS transcript
- Campus Education Plan
 - Fillable form
- Parent Consent/Financial Responsibility Form (required under state law)
 - Fillable form and double-sided



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Course Placement Testing

- **Reminder!** Eligibility does not equal Admission; Admission does not equal course placement.
- Course placement requirements vary by course:
 - Composition Placement Test for English and Communications
 - ALEKS for Math and some Science
 - We do not use the YSU Eligibility/Admission Test (aka Accuplacer) for course placement.
- Will continue to offer course placement testing at the high school.
- Students who do not test at the HS are notified by YSU what tests they need to complete.



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Priority Course Placement Testing Deadlines

Desired Start Term	Placement Testing Deadline
Summer 2024	April 15, 2024
Fall 2024 Campus/Online Classes High School Based Courses	June 17, 2024 July 22, 2024
Spring 2025	October 22, 2024

- There is no guarantee that any course placement testing completed after the priority deadline for each term will be scored in time to register for classes.
- Students are encouraged to have all course placement testing completed as early as possible.
- Last ACT/SAT test dates accepted for course placement by term are:

ACT

- Summer - April
- Fall – July
- Spring – December

SAT

- Summer - March
- Fall – June
- Spring - December



Continuing Student Advisement/Registration

- Attends CCP Update Session
 - Completes at time of re-application if done at school; virtually later if completed on their own
- If the student is taking classes...
 - **On campus or online**, the YSU CCP Office contacts student to schedule advising appt
 - **Only at the high school**, advisement is completed during CCP Updates Session
- Course Registration
 - Students can register for summer and fall campus/online classes in April after meeting with advisor
 - The CCP Office will register students for courses they qualify for at the HS



New Student Advisement, Orientation, and Registration

- **Advising Appointments:** *If the student is taking classes...*
 - **On campus or online**, the YSU CCP Office contacts student to schedule advising appt.
 - **Only at the high school**, advisement is completed during New Student Orientation.

- **New Student Orientation**
 - At the HS or virtual
 - Students who complete orientation at the high school, and want to take campus or online classes, will also attend a virtual Campus Registration Day.
 - Our office schedules the student for session during their advising appointment.

- **Course Registration**
 - Students register themselves for campus/online courses after meeting with YSU advisor.
 - The CCP Office will register students for courses they qualify for at the HS.
